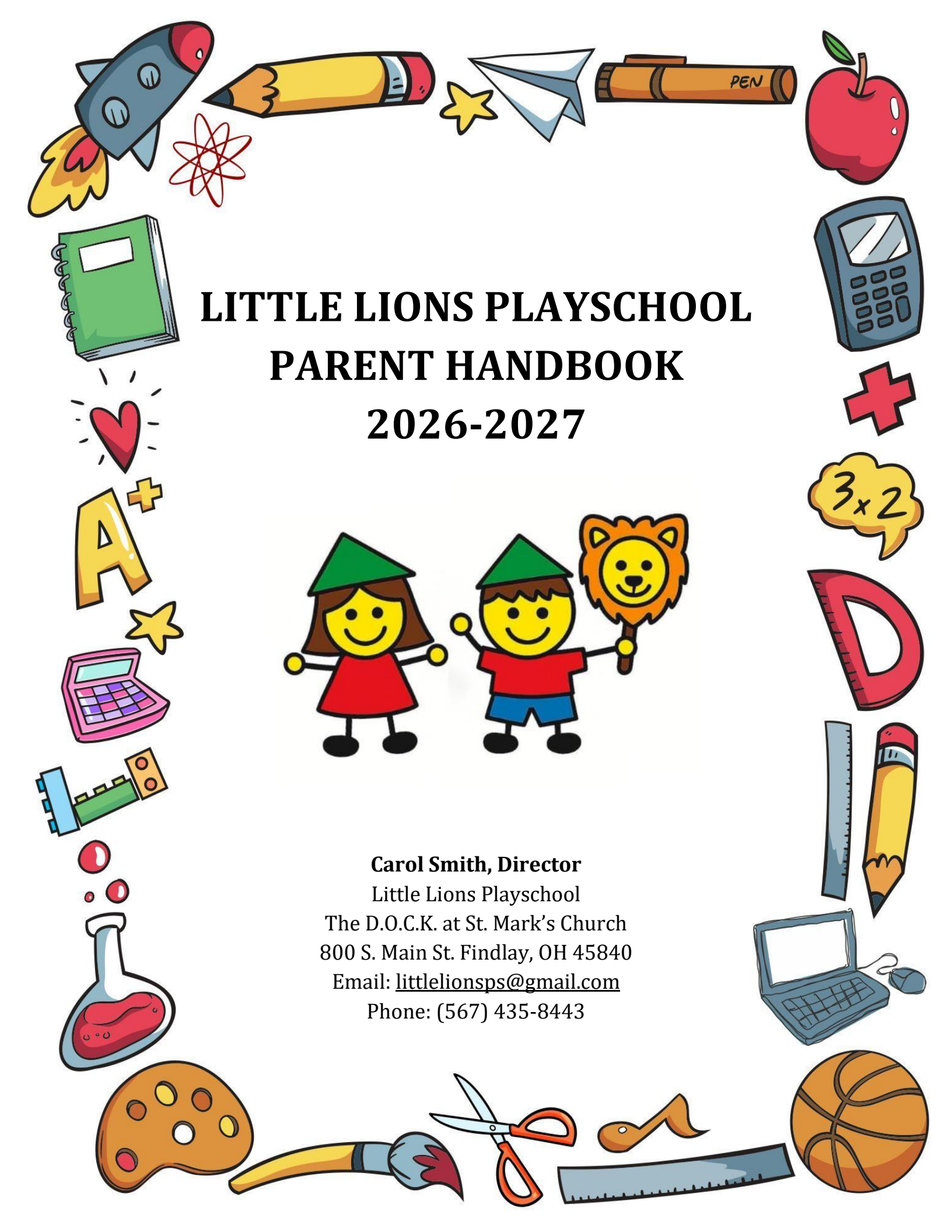




LITTLE LIONS PLAYSCHOOL PARENT HANDBOOK 2026-2027



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Little Lions Playschool typically offers four/five classes:

1. 2 Day 3 Year Old Class meets Tuesday and Thursday from 9:00-11:30am. The tuition is \$160/month with a one-time materials fee of \$75.
2. 3 Day 3 Year Old Class meets Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9:00-11:30am. The tuition is \$175/month with a one-time materials fee of \$85.
3. 3 Day 4 Year Old Class meets Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9:30-12:00pm with the option of attending a 4th day on Tuesdays (availability based upon enrollment). The tuition is \$175/month for the 3 Day Class and \$195/month with the 4th day option and a one-time materials fee of \$85.
4. PM Class meets Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 12:30-3:00pm (availability based upon enrollment). The tuition is \$175/month with a one-time materials fee of \$85.
5. 5 Day 4 Year Old Class meets Monday-Friday from 9:00-11:30am. The tuition is \$225/month with a one-time materials fee of \$95.

Enrollment for the 3 year olds is 11 children, enrollment for the 3-day 4 year olds is up to 13 children, and enrollment for the 5-day 4 year olds is up to 20 children. All classes have two teachers. Child/staff ratios are maintained in each classroom (1 teacher per 12 children for the 3's and 1 teacher per 14 children for the 4's). There is a non-refundable registration fee of \$55. There is also a one-time materials fee due in September.

Pre-Session Child-Care

We offer early care before morning classes begin, from 8:00 to 9:30am, at a rate of \$10 per session. This service must be paid by the end of each month. Drop-in care is available for students enrolled in morning classes, depending on availability and staffing. Please contact the director or a teacher at least 24 hours in advance if you'd like to arrange drop-in care.

Curriculum

Our curriculum is designed to support your child's development through age-appropriate, play-based learning. While all teachers follow the same core learning goals based on state standards, each teacher tailors their lesson plans to the needs and interests of their class. Plans for both 3 year old and 4 year old classrooms are posted weekly in each room.

Creative Free Play

During creative free play, children explore art materials, blocks, books, math manipulatives, dramatic play areas, and more. These hands-on experiences help develop creativity, social skills, and early academic foundations.

Parent Involvement

We value strong family partnerships! Parent-teacher conferences are required by the state and provide an opportunity to talk about your child's progress and experiences. Your child's teacher will reach out to schedule a time that doesn't interfere with class time. These meetings are a great time to connect, ask questions, and share insights. Parents are always welcome to schedule additional meetings with their child's teacher or the director as needed.

In the fall, we invite moms to join their child for a special evening of preschool fun during our "Mom & Me Tea." In the spring, dads will be invited in for "Dad and Me Night."

Note: Students will not have class *either* the morning of **or** the morning after these events.

Our 5 Day 4 Year Old Class also welcomes parent helpers during monthly stations- a great way to be part of your child's day!

Observations

Parents and guardians are always welcome to schedule a visit by prearranging an observation time with your child's teacher. This will be done at the director's discretion.

Special Days

Birthdays are such a big part of childhood! Since many birthdays fall when school isn't in session, each child is assigned a "Special Day" during the year to celebrate them. Teachers will share more about how these days work at the informational meeting in the fall.

Guests

We love when families want to share our school with others! While we wish we could accommodate all visits from extended family and friends, we must prioritize the safety and routine of our students. Visitors are welcome to stop in and tour the school, but children cannot attend class for the day unless they are officially enrolled and accompanied by a parent or guardian for a specific, approved reason.

Discipline

Our program is built around positive, age-appropriate guidance for 3, 4, and 5 year olds. We focus on helping children understand boundaries and develop self-regulation through gentle, respectful strategies. These include:

- Redirection
- Clear, logical consequences
- Time apart within the classroom when needed
- Brief removal from the group (with support)

Our approach always keeps the child's emotional well-being and self-esteem at the center. Teachers explain the situation in age-appropriate ways and encourage children to find solutions together. Children are never left alone or unsupervised. If a situation arises where a child may need to be suspended or removed from the program, the decision will involve the teachers, director, and the family.

All staff are trained and committed to supporting your child's development, in line with licensing rule #5101:2-12-18.

Arrival and Dismissal

Morning classes begin at 9:00 or 9:30, while the afternoon class begins at 12:30pm. To help teachers prepare, we ask that families arrive as close to class start time as possible.

Drop off:

To make drop-off easier, a teacher or the director will meet your child at the exterior doors during the following windows:

- 9:00-9:10
- 9:30-9:40
- 12:30-12:40

Please pull up near the door and a teacher will assist your child out of the car. You will then veer left and exit between the D.O.C.K. and the church onto Lima Ave.

If you arrive outside of these times or no staff member is at the door, you are welcome to park in the church lot and walk your child up.

Pick-Up:

Classes end promptly at 11:30am, 12:00pm, or 3:00pm (depending on the class). During dismissal, you will enter the same car line you did at drop-off with your car tag visible, and a staff member will walk your child out and load them into the car. If you would prefer not to wait in the car line, you are welcome to park in the church lot and walk up to the doors to pick up your child. More detailed information with a diagram will be in the September newsletter.

Car Pools

We need your permission for your child to ride with someone other than their parent/guardian. The names of these drivers need to be included on their carpool form. This approved list will be kept on file at the center. If there is ever a change in pick-up, please let the staff know.

Weather and Calamity Closures

Snow/Calamity Policy:

Please listen to the local radio station, WFIN, during inclement weather to find out if Little Lions Playschool is closed. If there is a closure, you will receive a text through Little Lions Playschool (419-581-5599). You can also sign up for text alerts through WFIN's website.

Missed Days Policy:

In the event of multiple weather-related closings:

- 2 Day Classes will make up days if more than 4 days are missed
- 3 Day Classes will make up days if more than 5 days are missed
- 5 Day Classes will make up days if more than 7 days are missed

You're always welcome to call or email the school with questions. Please make the best decision for your family's safety when weather conditions are questionable.

Note: The school may close for additional reasons such as illness, maintenance, or other emergencies. The school will also not be in operation during poll days.

Safety Policy

Your child's safety is our top priority. Here's how we ensure a secure environment:

- A teacher will greet your child at drop-off and ensure they get safely to their classroom.
- At pick-up, children will only be released to authorized adults. If someone new is picking up your child, we must be notified in advance- **no exceptions.**
- Custody documentation (if applicable) must be on file.
- Children are never left alone or unsupervised.
- The building is locked throughout school hours. The only exceptions to this are when the preschool hosts family events (Halloween parade, Christmas programs, etc.) and every other month when the Red Cross hosts the blood drive in the D.O.C.K.

Field Trips:

- Permission slips signed by a parent or guardian are required.
- All staff members are trained in first aid and a first aid kit will always be available.
- Every child will wear a tag with the school's name, address, and phone number.
- Emergency health forms will be carried on all trips.

A parent or guardian is required to attend field trips with their child.

Emergency Preparedness:

- Monthly fire drills are held at different times to ensure readiness.
- Emergency and weather alert plans are posted in all classrooms.
- If an accident or emergency occurs, an incident report will be completed, and parents will be notified.
- Emergency transportation will be used if necessary (a form must be completed if you choose for your child not to be transported).

All staff are trained on safety protocols and have access to clear, written procedures. We take your child's well-being seriously and are prepared to act quickly if needed. Safety and emergency plans will also be posted in each classroom.

Lockdown Drills:

We conduct lockdown drills throughout the year in coordination with local law enforcement. Families will be notified before and after each drill. Teachers will explain that this procedure helps keep everyone safe in the rare event of a dangerous situation. Once

the drill or emergency is over, the director will announce an “all clear” through the intercom using a pre-approved password.

Snacks

Snack time is an important and enjoyable part of our day! A monthly snack menu is posted in each classroom. Teachers or the director may occasionally substitute or supplement food items as needed and will always accommodate allergies or dietary restrictions.

Emergency Procedures

In the event of a general emergency (such as severe weather, power outage, or natural disaster):

- **Fire:** Children and staff will exit through the nearest classroom door, with alternate options also identified. Teachers will bring attendance sheets, emergency forms, and a first aid kit. The teacher will be the last person to leave the room and will shut the door.
- **Tornado Warning:** Children will evacuate to the women’s and men’s restroom. Children will remain seated, and clearance to leave will be given by staff.
- If school must close due to loss of power, water, or heat, families will be notified to pick up children.

In the Event of a Serious Illness or Injury:

If a child requires urgent medical care:

- One teacher will stay with the child, administer first aid, and call the parent or guardian.
- The child will be cared for in a quiet area until a family member arrives.
- If needed, we will contact emergency services (Hanco or Med Corp), and a staff member will accompany the child to the hospital with their health form and records.
- The child’s medical file will be taken, and a staff member will remain with them until a parent or guardian arrives.

Health and Illness Policy

Please notify the school if your child is ill or will miss class. If your child contracts a contagious illness (such as chickenpox), let your child’s teacher or the director know right away. Families will be informed in writing if any communicable diseases have been identified in the classroom.

Teachers may ask that a child be picked up if they appear too ill to fully participate in class or pose a risk to others. Minor cold symptoms may be acceptable based on the director’s judgement. **Please note:** Children who are well enough to attend school are expected to

participate in all scheduled activities- indoors and outdoors. Teachers cannot make exceptions for one child to remain inside without both staff members present.

Change of clothes: Each child should have a spare set of clothes (underwear, shirt, pants, socks) kept at school in a shoebox labeled with their name (provided by the school). In case of spills or accidents, children are more comfortable changing into their own clothes. Please send seasonally appropriate clothing and plan to update the set mid-year as your child grows.

Management of Communicable Diseases

To protect all children and staff, we follow state guidelines for monitoring and managing illness:

- A trained staff member observes each child daily for signs of illness
- If a child appears unwell, a parent or guardian will be notified immediately.
- If a child shows **any of the following symptoms**, they will need to be picked up right away and may not return until they are symptom-free for **at least 24 hours**:
 - Diarrhea (3+ loose stools in 24 hours) or repeated vomiting
 - Severe coughing that causes redness or whooping sound
 - Difficulty or rapid breathing
 - Yellowish skin or eyes
 - Eye redness, discharge, or crustiness
 - Fever of 100 degrees or higher with other symptoms
 - Untreated rashes, skin patches, or sores
 - Unusual drowsiness or confusion
 - Stiff neck with fever
 - Signs of lice, scabies, or parasites
 - Severe sore throat or trouble swallowing

A visual communicable disease guide is available in the hallway for staff reference, along with a chart to help identify common symptoms.

If a Medical Emergency Happens:

If a child experiences a serious medical emergency:

- We will call **Hanco Ambulance** to transport your child to **Blanchard Valley Regional Health Center**.
- Parents/guardians will be notified immediately to meet their child at the hospital.
- If parents cannot be reached, emergency contacts listed on your child's Health & Enrollment Form will be called.
- A certified staff member will stay with the child and provide first aid as needed.

Important Reminders:

- Children must be symptom-free (no fever, vomiting, or diarrhea) for **24 hours** before returning to school.
- We do not administer vitamins.
- Prescription medication can only be given if a **DCY 01217 form** is completed. Medications are securely stored and administered by trained staff.
- We follow the **Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)** and provide necessary accommodations for:
 - Administering medication to children with disabilities
 - Safe medical care procedures tailored to individual needs

Field Trips

We love giving children opportunities to explore the world beyond the classroom! Field trips are an exciting part of our curriculum.

- Parents are responsible for arranging their own child's transportation.
- Parents must remain with their child during the field trip.
- Teachers will meet children at the destination.
- Attendance records will be taken to the field trip, and the children will be checked in and out.
- Child/staff ratios will be maintained on field trips.
- Signed permission slips will be on record for each trip.

Please note: pre-session care will not be available on field trip days unless prior arrangements have been made.

Outdoor Walks/Play & Large Motor Activities

Each day, the students will participate in large motor activities, which may include outdoor walks or play indoors in our designated large motor space.

Outdoor play/walks will not occur on days when the temperature is below 32°, the wind chill is below 32°, it is raining, if there is a storm threatening, or if chemicals have recently been applied to the lawn. On these days, children will go to the "large muscle" room.

What to Wear

Children participate in all kinds of hands-on activities, so we recommend sending your child in **comfortable, weather-appropriate play clothes**. Please label jackets, mittens, hats, and boots with your child's name.

Registration Process

Families already enrolled or previously enrolled in our program will receive priority re-enrollment before the school year starts. New families are invited to submit their registration beginning in February on a first-come, first-served basis.

To enroll your child: Complete and return a Registration Form with a non-refundable annual fee of \$55 to the director.

Over the summer, enrolled families will need to fill out all required forms which are located on the Little Lions Playschool website (www.littlelionsps.com).

These forms include:

- Medical statement (DCY 01305)
- Child Health & Enrollment Form (DCY 01234)
- Personal History Profile
- Tuition Agreement

Note: The Child Health & Enrollment Form **must** be completed before a child can attend. Immunization records (part of the DCY 01305 form) signed by a physician and parent, must be submitted within 30 days of the first day of school.

A class roster will be provided at the open house in the fall (contact information for families opting out of the list will not be shared).

A **waitlist** will be kept for any classes that are full. If a spot opens, we will offer it to the next family in line.

Little Lions Playschool will not accept children for enrollment if there is an outstanding tuition balance from a previously enrolled sibling or student. In some cases, a child may be withdrawn from the program if tuition is not paid, if there are ongoing behavioral concerns that cannot be resolved after collaboration between the family, teachers, and director, or if the child is not fully potty-trained.

Facebook

Little Lions Playschool has a public Facebook page where pictures and information may be posted. Any parent who signed a form stating they do not want their child on social media will **not** be included in any posts.

Each class also has their own **private** Facebook group where teachers will post pictures and reminders throughout the school year. This is a great way to stay involved and see what fun activities your child has been up to!

ENACTED Appendix **Center Parent Information 5180:2-12-07**

The child care center is licensed to operate legally by the Ohio Department of Children and Youth (DCY). This license is posted in a noticeable place for review.

A toll-free phone number is listed on the license and may be used to report a suspected violation of the licensing law or administrative rules. The licensing rules governing child care are available for review online at <https://codes.ohio.gov/ohio-administrative-code/chapter-5180:2-12>.

Administrators and each employee of the center are required, under Section 2151.421 of the Ohio Revised Code, to report their suspicions of child abuse or child neglect to the local public children's services agency.

Any parent of a child enrolled in the center is permitted unlimited access to the center during all hours of operation for the purpose of contacting their children, evaluating the care provided by the center, or evaluating the premises. Upon entering the premises, the parent or guardian shall is to notify the Administrator of their presence.

Licensing records, including licensing inspection reports, complaint investigation reports, and evaluation forms from the building and fire departments, are available for review upon written request from DCY. Early care and education program information and inspections are also online using the Child Care Search Tool on the DCY website at <https://childrenandyouth.ohio.gov/families/early-care-education/child-care-search>.

It is unlawful for the center to discriminate in the enrollment of children upon the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin or disability in violation of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 104 Stat. 32, 42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq. To file a discrimination complaint, write or call Health and Human Services (HHS) or DCY. HHS and DCY are equal opportunity providers and employers.
